

COPOLAD - Walking through the Community

Experience "Community Guides"

The activity "Community Guides", in partnership with the Núcleo de Articulação Comunitária e Afirmativa (NACA) of the Instituto Mirante de Arte e Cultura and the organisation Casa da Sopa as guides, members of the community itself, will allow participants to learn about the context in which the neighbourhood was formed, with the arrival of migrants fleeing from the drought that plagued places of the interior of Brazil.

The guides have been trained through a partnership between the Cooperation Programme between Latin America, the Caribbean and the European Union on Drug Policy (COPOLAD III), Estação das Artes, Banco do Nordeste (BNB), the organisation Casa da Sopa, Instituto Empodera and Conexão

O Moura Brasil - (Oitão Preto)

The history of the neighbourhood dates back to the arrival of migrants fleeing the drought from the interior of the country. The authorities tried to prevent these people from entering the city. For this reason, Arraial Moura Brasil or "Curral" appears as a concentration camp to house them, who remained in the territory, but could not move around the city. They only received food and water.

This neighbourhood is also known as **Oitão Preto**. According to stories from neighbours in the community, it was given this code name because of a historical period when wealthy men frequented the existing houses of prostitution in the community. These so called "pensions" housed women who had fled the drought and misery of their hometowns and were forced to prostitute themselves to survive.

These places were an "oitão", a closed building with no windows and walls painted black. This was the origin of a name that the community tries to avoid.

Location: Raizes da Periferia

Location: Praça do Muriçoca
