


- General Overview Lac of Homelessness Lac
- Lack of access to Education, Social Services
 - Lack of access to clean water and sanitation
 - Prone to Physical/ Sexual abuse
 - Severe Drug Abuse
 - Lack of general social support



Current Mental Health Services

- In-patient services: medication review, Psychotherapy, etc.
- Continued reintegration of routine Mental Health Services into Primary Healthcare
- Revitalization of In-patient Substance abuse group
- Community Mental Health Services-Decentralized mobile clinic in the varied geographical communities
- Limited Private and Public sector response: Counselling, Social assistance, Temporary housing, Food drives etc.
- Awareness Programmes
- Mental Health Act
- National Health Sector Strategic Plan



Rehabilitation Challenges

- Housing Insecurity is one of the gaps in service to rehabilitation/recovery of Psychiatric patients/Substance Use Issues
- Psychiatric patients with Substance Use issues: limited access to healthcare, stable housing and employment, social/financial assistance affecting recovery/rehabilitation
- Lost to Follow-up for care, treatment and support



Rehabilitation Challenges

- Institution overcrowding
- Accessibility of substances
- Stigma and Discrimination of the different populations
- Abandonment and Neglect

Specific to Homelessness-Mental Health Services in SVG

- Definition of Homelessness
- Lack of evidence on Homelessness in SVG
- No national/comprehensive strategy on Homelessness
- Limited funding directed to alleviate Homelessness
- Locating clients for follow-up care and treatment
- Inadequate Social Support (private and public sector)
- Stigma and Discrimination

- Strengthening the care, treatment and support of those with mental health conditions and substance use issues or disorders
- Appropriate utilization of in country trained personnel in Substance Use care and treatment
- Research on Homelessness in St. Vincent and the Grenadines (Gender, Geographics, Issues, etc.)

Way Forward

Way Forward

- The development of cohesive national strategy on Homelessness including linkage to other sectors; Community based approaches
- The need for adequate:
 Shelters
 Half-way homes and drug
 rehabilitation centres and substance
 use treatment programmes including
 day centres and self-help groups
- Helping institutions can be used as "one-stop" facilities where clients can access basic healthcare, including mental health services and other basic services
