




The Network of Researchers on Narcotic Drugs (NRND)

- The University of the Southern Caribbean (USC)
- The Ministry of Health, Research and Policy Unit (MOH)
- The Ministry of National Security, Research Unit (MNS)



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Objectives of the Network of Researchers

Research Collaboration

Encourages interdisciplinary teamwork for comprehensive research.

Policy and Advocacy

Informs policies with evidence-based recommendations.




Data and Resource Sharing

Enhances research efficiency through shared resources and methodologies.

- ✓ NDC: Provides leadership and coordination for drug policy and research ensuring alignment with the National Research Agenda
- ✓ SSA: Provides security insights linking supply reduction with National Security
- ✓ NADAPP: Focuses on demand reduction through prevention, treatment and rehabilitation programmes
- ✓ USC : Adds academic capacity, methodological rigour and evidence-based recommendations for drug control
- ✓ MOH: Ensures drug research and policy link directly with public health priorities and healthcare delivery
- ✓ MNS: Facilitates evidence-based policy making by working collaboratively with the NDC

Lessons from the Call for Proposals



 Communication barriers and lengthy approval processes slowed progress Agencies responded positively, valuing the research network and national agenda despite initial challenges.

 Despite the challenges, the network successfully collaborated to develop the National Research Agenda

Dialogue between Research Network and Policymakers

- ✓ Collaboration was led by the National Drug Council, responsible for drug policy & National Drug Control Plan 2021–2025.
- ✓ Research findings informed policy priorities (e.g., gender & criminal justice, rise of synthetic drugs, clandestine labs).
- ✓ Data from the Drug Information Network provided evidence for identifying gaps & needs.
- Regular meetings & consultations held with researchers, academics and technical experts.
- Continuous exchange ensured research guided policy, and policy objectives shaped research.
- ✓ Process informed both the 2021–2025 plan and preparation of the 2026–2030 plan.

- I. Domestic Production, Distribution and/or Trafficking of Synthetic Drugs
- II. Determinants, Prevalence, and Patterns, of Drug Use (including Synthetic Drugs), among Vulnerable, Marginalized and High-Risk Groups
